# HISTORICAL SPOTLIGHT:

# MILLBRAE HIGHLANDS-YOUR PLACE IN THE SUNSHINE

In 1947, one year before I was born, my parents moved to Millbrae and my Dad started his business on the corner of Millbrae Avenue and El Camino Real. Our first house was in Bayside Manor, a few blocks away. Mom and Dad bought their "dream house" for a tidy sum of \$4,000. By 1957, after the big earthquake that rocked Millbrae, our family had grown to four children, and the six of us were busting out at the seams in our small two-bedroom house. One of my Dad's close friends had just purchased a house in the Millbrae Highlands and decided to sell it. We scooped it up for a bargain price of \$16,000. All the neighborhoods in Millbrae are great places to live and raise your family, but I feel I was so lucky to grow up in the Millbrae Highlands. Living in the Highlands, it is only a short walk to downtown or to Friendship or Burlingame Plazas, and a lot of the houses have great bay views and a short walk to schools. The style of the houses in the Highlands are like no other in Millbrae. They are a mixture of Spanish and Mission-Style homes along with a few English cottages and Tudors. Most homes have two stories and great basements. The setting is traditional early 20th century suburb with

Remember the 1941 hit movie Casablanca, starring Ingrid Bergman and Humphrey Bogart - the title song was As Time Goes By. Well, at the Millbrae Historical Museum and Train Museum we are dedicated to capturing time, where we can look back at the past and plan for the future.

Here's one example of the past: the Oscar Meyer Wienermobile. "Wienermobile" is the name for a series of automobiles shaped like a hot dog on a bun which are used to promote and advertise Oscar Mayer products in the United States. The first version was created in 1936 by Oscar Mayer's nephew, Carl G. Mayer, and variants are still used by the Oscar Mayer Company today. Drivers of the Wienermobile are known as Hotdoggers and often hand out toy whistles shaped as



replicas of the Wienermobile, known as Wienerwhistles. Well, the Wienermobile is still around today. This picture of the Wienermobile was taken last October as it

# VICE-PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings MHS Trustees, members, family and friends.

Aloha! As of this writing I am just back from my trip to Maui...we had a great quick vacation.

It's almost time for the famous Millbrae Historical Society 4th of July BBQ & Raffle. Look in this newsletter for info about this delicious and entertaining event which will take place at the David Chetcuti Room near the Millbrae Library. Please RSVP ASAP. I hope you can be there to enjoy all the fun!

The following items are noteworthy historical happenings connected with the month of June:

June 1st - Marilyn Monroe (1926-1962) was born in Los Angeles (as Norma Jean Mortensen). Following an unstable childhood spent in foster homes and orphanages, she landed a job as a photographer's model which led to a movie career. She later married baseball legend Joe DiMaggio. She died in Los Angeles from an overdose of sleeping pills on August 5, 1962. Best known for Gentlemen Prefer Blondes (1953), The Seven Year Itch (1955), and Some Like It Hot (1959).

June 3, 1937 - The Duke of Windsor married Wallis Warfield Simpson in Monts, France. As King Edward VIII. he had abdicated the British throne in December of 1936 amid tremendous controversy to marry Simpson, an American who had been divorced. Following the wedding, the couple lived in France and had minimal contact with the British Royal family.

June 5, 1968 - Robert F. Ken**nedy** was shot and mortally wounded while leaving the Hotel Ambassador in Los Angeles. The shooting occurred after a celebration of Kennedy's victory in the California presidential primary. He died at 1:44 a.m., June 6, at age 42, leaving behind his wife Ethel and eleven children, the last one born after his death. Allied with the plight of the poor and disadvantaged in America, he spoke out against racial discrimination, economic injustice and the Vietnam War.

June 6, 1944 - D-Day, the largest amphibious landing in history, began

in the early-morning hours as Allied forces landed in Normandy on the northern coast of France. Operation Overlord took months of planning and involved 1,527,000 soldiers in 47 Allied divisions along with 4,400 ships and landing craft, and 11,000 aircraft. By the end of the day 150,000 Allied soldiers and their accompanying vehicles had landed with 15,000 killed and wounded.

June 10th - Judy Garland (1922-1969) was born in Grand Rapids. Minnesota (as Frances Gumm). She is best remembered for her portrayal of Dorothy Gale in The Wizard of Oz (1939) and other films including Meet Me in St. Louis (1944) and Easter Parade (1948). She was found dead of an overdose of sleeping pills on June 22, 1969.

beautiful tree-lined streets.

In 1927, Neils Schultz, owner and developer of the Millbrae Highlands Co., started the development of the Millbrae Highlands "Homes on Rolling Hills". Schultz and his family lived in the subdivision they were The Highlands Real developing.

Estate office was located at 1 Hillcrest, and the family made their home on Hazel Avenue, where they lived until 1950. Unlike most developers, Schultz raised his family in Millbrae and was very active in community and civic affairs. Millbrae named a park after him (Schultz Park) close to Taylor School. When the Highlands development Schultz was finished. moved to Greenbrae in Marin County to start a new development. Neils created an advertisement slogan about Millbrae Highlands in 1927 -

# "Your Place in the Sun-

**shine**". Most agree that our official City slogan "Your Place in the Sun" was coined from this 1927 ad campaign.

Back in the day, we had two great elementary schools in our neighbor-One of these was Chadbourne School, which was made possible through a \$3000 bond issued in 1889 for the school on the corner of Poplar & Chadbourne Avenues. As the years went on, the new school needed more room, so in

also added. During my years at Chadbourne from 1954-1960, the cafeteria served up some of the best "Sloppy Joes" in town!

The second school in our neighborhood, Highlands Elementary School, was opened in 1952. In 1979, the School District's concerns about

> changing lifestyles and smaller families led them to close Chadbourne and Highlands and another school on the other side of town, Glen Oaks Elementary.

> In 1938, Life Magazine took notice of the beautiful homes being built in the Millbrae Highlands. They chose a house on Hillcrest Blvd. near Corte Dorado to be their "Life Model Home".

> Today we are very fortunate to still live in the Millbrae Highlands. We have raised our children in our safe Millbrae

neighborhoods, and they have attended the great schools here.


