her as the sixteenth Mayor of Millbrae. She served a second term as Mayor in 1965. Josephine Waugh's signature political position was her intense opposition to the construction of a multi-lane highway, the Junipero Serra Highway, that the State of California Division of Highways planned to construct right through the middle of Millbrae. Mrs. Waugh, her fellow Council members, and the community at-large eventually convinced the State to terminate the highway project. The abandoned highway route was later acquired by the City, and is now home to the Spur Trail, enjoyed by local walkers and bicyclists young

and old. Mrs. Waugh and her husband passed away in 1978. In honor of Mrs. Waugh's valiant battle against the highway juggernaut, the City dedicated a section of the property as **Josephine Waugh Soroptimist Park** in 1987.

Following the historic precedent established by Josephine Waugh,



several other women have gone on to serve Millbrae as its mayor, including Mary Griffin in the 1980s, Janet Fogarty and **Doris Morse** in the 1990s, and Linda Larson, Nadia Holober, Gina Papan, and Marge Co**lapietro** in the 2000s. In honor of these notable women and their individual achievements, I will be interviewing several of Millbrae's past female mayors as part of the program at our Annual Fourth of July BBQ. Please plan on attending this festive event for good food, good company, and a little bit of history. And while you're eating, take a moment to thank Josephine Waugh.
