HISTORICAL SPOTLIGHT: 1958 BY TOM DAWDY

A lot of things happened in Millbrae in 1958, as our young town celebrated its 10 Year Anniversary and completed several major upgrades. Millbrae had just wrapped up an interesting year in 1957. The Junipero Serra Highway that was projected to be constructed right through the heart of Millbrae had been rejected, a new Giants Stadium planned for the end of Millbrae Avenue with a marina and a helicopter port had been nixed. Millbrae was still reeling from a major earthquake that shut down the business district. The quake broke all the plate glass windows at the Safeway store on Broadway and Hillcrest, and knocked all the food off the shelves at Kilpatrick's and Safeway. One of the big stories on the 6 o'clock news was the "River of Booze" running down Broadway from all the broken bottles at the (continued on Page 4)

All you bargain hunters out there mark your calendars for Saturday, August 9th for our annual Millbrae Historical Society Rummage Sale, held directly in front of the Millbrae Museum. Our Assistant Curator Dorothy Semke has lined up some unusual, gently-used merchandise that is ready to be sold at bargain basement prices. We always have a great time and enjoy seeing all our Millbrae friends and neighbors who come down to shop. If you have any donations for the rummage sale, bring them to the Museum or contact Dorothy and we will pick them up.

At the April meeting of the Millbrae Historical Society Board of Trustees meeting, the Board unanimously voted to provide the funding to restore our cherished **Larkin's Surrey**. We will be purchasing four new wheels, powdercoating the frame, painting the wood, and re-upholstering the seats. Our Blue Ribbon Committee on the restoration of the surrey, **Cathy Quigg** and **Vern Bruce**, has worked diligently to restore our surrey to as close as possible to its original condition. The photo below is the Larkin's surrey as it appeared when it was housed at the **Wells Fargo Bank** in Millbrae.



As I mentioned in the last newsletter's Presidents Message, the Millbrae Historical Society Museum exterior is in deplorable condition and in need of extensive restoration work. After I wrote a detailed letter, including photographs, to the Millbrae City Council and Public Works Director, the Millbrae Museum Exterior Restoration project was placed on the **City Council** agenda for consideration. After several months of budget reviews and consideration, I am delighted to be able to inform you that on June 10th the Millbrae City Council passed their FY 2014–15 budget, which included funding to restore the exterior of our beloved museum. I will keep you informed as to the status and time frame for restoration and painting of the museum exterior. We have not yet determined when and where our annual **Millbrae Historical Society Field Trip** will be this year. We usually hold it after school starts in September in order to avoid the crowds. I'm sure we will select a great destination, and we will have a wonderful, educational time. We will keep you posted. If you have any ideas about a destination for our annual Millbrae Historical Society Field Trip, please let me know. For example, I will suggest visiting an historic winery in the Napa or Sonoma Valley wine country.

Remember the old Millbrae Lions Scout House, built in 1954 by the Millbrae Lions Club, located behind Taylor Middle School on property owned by the Millbrae School District. Vandalized and abandoned for many years, the building has now found new life as the Millbrae Community Youth Center. Through private funding and a herculean community effort by the Peninsula Chinese Business Association, the Central Peninsula Church of Millbrae. Rebuilding Together Peninsula. the Millbrae Rotary, Millbrae Lions Club, and the Millbrae Commu**nity Foundation**, the building has now been restored to its former glory and brought up to Americans with Disabilities Act standards. Since the City wants sustainability and maximum use of the new center, the plan is to use it for meetings of the Boy Scouts and soccer teams, along with after-school programs. A six-month pilot program to partner with the Mid-Peninsula Boys and Girls Clubs to run after-school activities such as cooking, a homework hour, and art classes is underway.

As the summer weather approaches and the days are longer, please get out and enjoy all the wonderful things Millbrae has to offer. Check out the **Millbrae Historical Society Museum** and our **Southern Pacific Railroad museum**. Have a picnic in one of our beautiful parks. Hope to see you at the **Millbrae Art and Wine Festival**, where our award-winning Millbrae Historical Society **Southern Pacific Fire Engine** will be on display. Don't forget the **Millbrae Machines Car Show** on August 16th. Most of all, please patronize the great variety of Millbrae restaurants and remember to "Shop Millbrae".

Thank you to the members of the **Millbrae Historical Society Board of Trustees** for your dedication and hard work, and to the entire Millbrae Historical Society for continuing to move forward to protect and preserve the colorful history of Millbrae and the surrounding area!

Highlands Liquor Store. In the Fall, the City purchased some 1957 Chevy police cars from **Smallcomb Chevrolet** in San Bruno (I'll bet the Millbrae Historical Society would give anything to have one of those '57 Chevy Millbrae Police Cars in our collection!). But in the end, Millbrae survived 1957, and the calendar pages turned to 1958

In January 1958, the City of Millbrae was ready to unveil its new **Civic Center** and **Police Station**. Everything was ready for a big celebration! A huge parade took place downtown and several thousand people turned out to celebrate

Millbrae's new City Hall, Police Station, and the Fire Station (that had opened in 1956). **San Francisco Mayor George Christopher** dedicated the modern "State of the Art" facilities.

January 1958 was a very busy month for Millbrae, as the **Millbrae Municipal Water System** was also finished and dedicated. This accomplishment had been set in motion in 1952, when Millbrae voters approved an \$850,000 bond measure to build the big water tank up on Skyline Boulevard (next to the Chevron Station) and combine the two previous water districts into one.

Millbrae took another big step forward in 1958 when they dedicated their new **Sewage Treatment Plant.** This project was made possible through the passage of a \$400,000 bond measure in 1952 by a margin of 8 to 1. In the early 1950's, most cities around the bay still pumped raw sewage along the shoreline, and the shores around the bay were lined with dumps that allowed folks to dump garbage with no restrictions for a small fee. Some people just dumped right along the shoreline at the end of Millbrae Avenue. I remember smelling the stench in the air like a backed-up sewer, and my Mom saying "It must be low tide". And she was right! The treatment plant was a big step in the right direction towards cleaning up the bay.

Mills High School was finished in 1958, but was formally dedicated on January 25, 1959. **Safeway** opened up their supermarket in 1958, and the **Stanaways** opened up their family market at the corner of Hillcrest and Broadway.

There have been a lot of changes in Millbrae over the past 65 years, but it will be hard to beat 1958!

CURATOR'S REPORT ALMA MASSOLO DOROTHY SEMKE

Recently we had a visit from Vanessa Poland of El Granada, who originally contacted us through our website. She had three dolls she wished to donate to the Museum. Two of the dolls dated back to the 1970s. The third doll belonged to her grandmother and is approximately 150 years old. It is a beautiful 16-inch hand-crafted porcelain doll along with a cedar chest full of homemade doll clothes. Vanessa's father had a UV-protected glass case with a back mirror made to exhibit this lovely doll. We thank Vanessa very much and appreciate this addition to the Museum.

We also want to thank **Penelope Martell** of San Jose for mailing us numerous old articles from Millbrae's past.

A new addition donated by **Charles** and Wendy Maynard of Millbrae can be seen in our kitchen. It consists of three pieces, two of which are over 100 years old. They donated a cast iron pot for making corn bread and a stove top cast iron waffle iron. The third piece is over 50 years old and is a cast iron pot used on Halloween mainly to make donuts for the children. We thank the Maynards so much for these items.

We have a baby doll donated by former Trustee and Woman of the Year Lois Way on display in the Heritage **Room** in an antique buggy. It is described as a Lily doll purchased in Hollywood in 1926-7 in her original clothing. This is a must-see item! Mrs. Way has also donated a Santa Fe plate. It is called Navajo Silversmith by E. Martin Hennings (1886-1956), who was famous for paintings of Western Indians. This piece can be seen in the Fran Baxter Room near two replica antique diecast cars - a Mercedes and a Rolls Royce, donated by our own Vice President Paul Larson.

Special thanks to Rudy Alva at Allied Security Alarms for providing alarm service at the Millbrae Historical Society Museum free of charge for many years. Thanks, Rudy!




